Llandyssil Old School Hall

One year ago the future of the Old school Hall was in doubt. There appeared to be no likelihood of reaching agreement on the proposed lease and there were serious concerns about the safety of the roof.

Today the lease is signed and working well with a mutually supportive relationship established between the Managing Trustees, representing The Church in Wales, and the Hall Trustees. The new roof is in place and work on the inside of the Hall and replacement of the flat roof is expected now to start in January. Users will be advised in good time when the Hall will be out of use – likely to be for about two weeks. Please watch notice boards. The Trustees would like to apologise for any inconvenience to all Hall users during this period.

Grants have now been applied for for the next phase of renovation which will include a new high quality wooden floor, double glazing of windows, rewiring, work on panelling and plastering and a new heating system. At this stage the capital costs of installing an environmentally innovative under floor system appear unrealistic especially in terms of relatively low Hall usage, but will be reviewed in the future. If, with the guidance and support of Cllr Wynne Jones, we can get the funding for Phase 2, the objective is to have all Phase 2 works completed by end March 2010 which will complete the obligations under the lease.

Some comments, made in a spirit of goodwill, have high-lighted the fact that as several of the new Trustees have families, are at College or working; their time is at a premium. It hoped that others in the village who are actively supporting work to renovate the Hall to be a better community facility for the village will feel free to offer their help. Their support and assistance would be really appreciated.

In future, Management Committee meetings will be held quarterly unless there is a specific project to discuss. Everyone is welcome. The next meeting will be held on Wednesday 25th March at 7.30 in the Hall

Gardeners' Notebook

As I write this I am reflecting on the 2008 gardening year in my garden. Not a good year for vegetables or flowers but, like all gardeners, I have made the best of what can only be described as a very wet summer. It did not deter the slugs from eating the vegetables, in fact they enjoyed them even more than usual! I am a lover of roses but the rain and wind did such damage to them, not to mention the black spot and mildew.

Now enough of the doom and gloom, let us look positively into next year with Spring just over two months away. Now is a quiet time for gardeners but I will be browsing those vegetable seed catalogues over Christmas and placing my order. Last year I was too ambitious, still being a novice vegetable grower, and ordered too many vegetables (I even had to distribute some in the flower beds!) or ones that needed too much looking after.

For any other novice vegetable growers this is what I have found to be relatively easy: Broad Beans, Runner Beans, Beetroot, Tomatoes, Peppers, Potatoes and Strawberries. I had a disaster with Purple Sprouting because the caterpillars got to them before I did. My cucumbers in the greenhouse were also a bad idea but I know other gardeners find them quite easy – any tips would be appreciated!

Next Year we are going to build a gazebo so I will keep you up-dated on the progress. We have to hope that the weather will allow us to use it.

The gardening club has been going from strength to strength over the year culminating with a very successful Christmas Social in December. Members and non-members came to hear Iolo Williams giving a very interesting and amusing talk on birds and nature in general. About 40 people very much enjoyed the talk as well as the refreshments. We have to thank Iolo for giving his time and making it such an enjoyable evening.

Other talks that we have had over the year were on Bees, A light-hearted talk on the Latin Names of Plants, the development of Dingle Nurseries, Dowsing for water and Making Hanging Baskets.

Community News

Report from your County Councillor.

There has been much publicity regarding the street lighting issue, much of which has been inaccurate. The situation is that with Powys County Council (like most public bodies) facing a very difficult financial situation, overspending on budgets cannot be allowed. A sudden and dramatic increase in energy costs placed the Council in a situation where the energy budget would be greatly overspent. Therefore the Board took emergency action that resulted in the switching off of 67% of all street lights (except those on Trunk roads and in core areas). This was only a short term, interim measure and it is intended to move to a system based more on part night lighting (where lights go off at 12.30am and come back on at 5.30am). This could not be done at the outset as, in order to achieve this, a sizeable amount of capital funding was needed to buy the timer units for each lighting standard. The situation today is that we have managed to find some slippage in the capital budget and some units have now been purchased allowing the Council to start introducing some part night lighting.

In Llandyssil the switch off happened on November 3rd, and hopefully by the end of January we should be able to make some changes, Hopefully we should be able to achieve a situation with 2/3lights in the village centre on all night, and the remainder on part night lighting. This should mean that there should be more lights on until 12.30am then there currently are, and two lights back on on Brooklyn, an area of the village where the situation is currently unsatisfactory.

Another issue is the long awaited 'passing place' on the entry road into the village. This has been in the capital programme for four years and the Council are desperate to get this work done. Unfortunately, the land is owned by the Church and getting the legals sorted with them is proving difficult. The Council has agreed everything with the Church in Wales and has requested permission to go ahead and complete the work. If that permission is forthcoming, the passing place will happen in February, if not, then it will be Autumn 2009, due to current ecology regulations.

The other outstanding issue is the Chapel crossroads and recently the Council has had traffic counters down there to establish traffic flow patterns. I am due to meet with Officers in the New Year to look at the results with a view to agreeing a possible change of priority at that junction.

Finally may I say how delighted I am that the first phase of the Village Hall refurbishment has been completed and I was pleased to facilitate the grant funding that has allowed this to happen. It is important that plans are now made for Phase 2., as future grant funding streams are uncertain in the current economic climate. I am currently working with the Officers of the Llandyssil Community Charitable Trust

with a view to arranging the required funding that will enable the second phase to go ahead.

May I, in conclusion, take this opportunity to thank all constituents for their support in the past year and offer my best wishes for 2009.

New Year's message for Abermule with Llandyssil Community Council

The New Year will be busy with a number of projects being considered. Following the successful completion and handover of responsibility for the new play area and the Millfields Amenity Land at Abermule, the Community Council are discussing the feasibility of employing a contractor / handy person to keep this area in good condition together with the other play area in Abermule and the play area in Llandyssil . It will be some of the areas of work for this contractor to collect the litter from all three play areas and to regularly inspect the play equipment to keep it safe for children to play on. If this post interests you keep an eye out for adverts locally together with the job vacancy section on our website www.abermulewithllandyssilcommunitycouncil.org.uk .

With regards to the Millfields Amenity Land we are in the process of making a grant application to secure monies for improvements for access to and from that land by laying a Tarmac path. If we are successful in our grant applications we will have to match fund this in order to complete our projects however with prudent financial management together with our thoughts on the economic climate we shall be asking Powys County Council to set the precept as follows an increase of £500 to £17300 which equates to a 2.98% increase

In Llandyssil last year we improved the play area with Phase two of the existing play area, the kerb was lowered and a new path leading to the play area to allow access for parents with pushchairs and those with restricted mobility and also a new notice board. This year we will make improvements to the land at the rear of Brooklyn. As soon as this area becomes dry enough attempts will be made to level the area and it will be reseeded.

Rural Stress and Village Angels

The Institute of Rural Health, based at Gregynog, is running a project aimed at raising awareness of rural stress and the resources available to deal with it.

In addition to the stress found in all areas of modern life the most obvious extra stress factor found in rural areas is isolation. This is not just to do with being lonely but is also about distance from services. Farmers working on their own (where in previous generations they might have had several other farm workers alongside them), rural craft-workers, the self-employed in small rural businesses, are all used to single working but it can be a problem if things are not going well, when there is nobody to act as a sounding-board or bounce ideas off.

There can also be the problem of people finding it difficult to talk to, even when they have the opportunity, and feeling they should be able to 'sort it themselves'. It can be difficult to admit to having a problem, and there can be a fear that admitting to suffering from stress will lead to a 'mental illness' label. In fact we all need help occasionally to get us over a difficult patch.

The Rural Stress & Wellbeing project has found that there is in fact a lot of support available but that people may not know about it or how to go about asking for help. A **Rural Support Wales** website has therefore been developed www.ruralsupportwales.org.uk which includes information about stress, such as signs and symptoms, what you can do to help yourself, and where you can go to for support. A map leads into a directory listing support organisations by county, with local or national contact numbers. The aim is to reduce the number of steps people have to take to find help.

And for people who are not computer-friendly there are also information cards and leaflets listing the main contact numbers for support services such as Cruse, CAB, Farm Crisis Network, Samaritans etc. These are available from Helen Porter at IRH on 01686 650800 and all this information is publicised at outreach events at, for example, livestock marts and farmers markets. However we are also setting up a new scheme called '**Village Angels**'

This is designed to train volunteers to be active in their home villages, as sources of support and information for the elderly and others in their village who may feel isolated or are not sure where to go for help. The Angels will visit, listen, link people in with existing local networks or signpost them to outside help. Angels are trained and supported and can make a real difference to their communities. Do you know someone in or near Llandyssil who could be an Angel? Could you?
