UPDATE FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

Highway works on Abermule bypass. Residents will have noticed that currently there are some underground cabling adjustments taking place at the north junction (adjacent to Canal Bridge) of the Abermule bypass. Once the cabling works are done, major works will begin in order to construct a very large lay-by, using the area that has traditionally been used by the County Council as a storage area (the old salt dump). This are actually belongs to Welsh Government as it was originally the old trunk road prior to Abermule bypass. The very large by-pass is to accommodate the wind farm traffic, and similar large lay-bys are being constructed at several points(currently one being constructed opposite Horseshoe Inn Nr.Berriew) along the trunk road on route to Garreg Llwyd wind farm. The wind farm traffic for this wind farm will begin about mid September and continue through to early December.

Highways works. The amount of outstanding works on Powys Highways now stands at £40million and outstanding bridge works at £9m. The total amount of Capital funding available to the Highways Service for next year stands at £5m, so it easy to see that the backlog of work will continue to rise whilst the Government's austerity measures continue in force. Within the Dolforwyn Ward there is only one capital scheme that made it through the priority ranking, and that is carriageway strengthening on the Dingle Road out of Abermule. This was in the programme for last year but did not happen due to overruns on other schemes, so this year there is an increased amount (£30k) to be spent on that section of Highway.

Funding from planning gain. Now that all the funding from 'planning gain' on previous development in Abermule has been received by the County Council, we are in a position to invest some funding into the relevant local facilities. The total amount of planning gain received was £46,500, but £11,000 was previously spent in constructing the play area on the Millfields Amenity area, so the balance now to be spent on local facilities is £35,500. Out of this £26,500 is earmarked for the School and will be spent on replacing all the old windows in the school with new UPC double glazed windows. This work will be carried out in the summer holidays. £6,500 will be spent, via the Community Council, on additional play equipment, which leaves £2,500 to be spent on the Community Centre. The funding for play equipment and the Community Centre, if included in a defined project, could qualify as community contribution towards possible capital grant funding applications which mean those amount could in reality be doubled.
