This will be the last time I write to you as Chair and Warden of Abermule Community Centre as I will formally stand down from both roles at our Annual General Meeting in July. I would like to thank the Community for entrusting me with our much loved Centre and the support and friendship given. Following my departure the Centre will be managed jointly by the Business Team which is formed of the Trustee body and interested parties. I would like to appeal for anyone who would like to support Abermule Community Centre either as a Trustee or part of a team of helpers, if you have a few hours to offer setting up for events, maintenance, litter picking etc, please get in touch.

To support our affiliated bodies establish following COVID-19, we will be offering affiliation at the reduced price of £10.00 (plus VAT) for the second year running. This is in appreciation of the reduced access to the centre due to COVID-19 restrictions and loss of fundraising opportunities. We are also able to offer FREE online CPD accredited courses such as child protection, food hygiene etc to ensure groups are able to become compliant and operate safely. Abermule Community Centre is prepared for opening for permitted use, a risk assessment and risk management plan is in place to ensure that those accessing the centre can do so safely. Groups that feel ready to access centre facilities (inside or out), should contact the Centre when we can discuss arrangements. Please note, at present due to cleaning/sanitising requirements, we are only able to offer fixed slots for bookings. This may mean that your "normal" time slot is unavailable. You may, temporarily, need to consider meeting at a different day or time.

As restrictions ease and confidence in accessing services rises, demand on our Outreach Project has slowly declined. After over 3000 interventions (prescription collections, welfare checks, shopping deliveries, transport for appointments ect), we are ready to wind down the project and will cease operations 1st June. We are supporting those still accessing the service to make longer term arrangements. The project has been a massive undertaking relying on a pool of volunteers who have given countless hours of their time to ensure that anyone in need has the provisions they have needed and have felt that they are still part of our Community even when isolating at home. A huge thank-you to all that have been a part, it has been a privilege to work with you.

Our AGM is scheduled for 1st July at 19:00. We hope we can meet at the centre, however, arrangements have been made to allow the meeting to be accessed online if required.

Abermule School News

We were all very happy to welcome the children back in school earlier this term. School life has soon returned to its usual busy days. We have also welcomed some new children and we are looking forward a healthy intake into Reception in September 2021. New members of staff, Miss Alice Morgan, class teacher, Miss Williams and Mrs Thomas, teaching assistants, have also joined us too.

ABERMULE with LLANDYSSIL COMMUNITY COUNCIL :

We have all faced unprecedented challenges since the onset of the pandemic, our sincere gratitude to our Community Volunteers who went above and beyond to protect the vulnerable in our communities.

The Community Council have continued monthly meetings online, log in details are included on the agenda. Our Annual Meeting was held via ZOOM on 5th May, when I was re-elected as Chair and Cllr. Paul Davis Vice-Chair for the next twelve months. Chairman's report along with agenda and Minutes of our meetings are available on the Community Council website. May 2022 ends this Councils term of office, when elections will be held for County, Town and Community Councils in Wales.

BUSINESS PARK UPDATE: North Powys Recycling Facility, PCC have applied to NRW (Natural Resources Wales) for waste permit Ref. PAN 013001. Regarded by NRW as of 'High Public Interest' with a six week consultation due to begin no earlier than 17th May. Business Units: Our objections regarding quantity over quality went unheeded with PCC once again approving their own application. PCC have since awarded the contract to SWG of Welshpool.

ABERMULE SCHOOL PUPILS wrote asking the Council for a Christmas tree in the village, to raise the spirits of residents suffering the effects of social isolation, moved by their letters the Council were pleased to oblige with trees and lights for both villages. Our thanks to the volunteers who erected the trees and with help we will continue this gesture in the future.

100th ANNIVERSARY OF ABERMULE TRAIN CRASH was commemorated on 26th January, 2021. I was honoured to lay a wreath on behalf of our Community, wreaths were also laid by County Cllr.Pugh for PCC and Network Rail. The Council also contributed to the cost of a memorial stone, to be erected on a site yet to be identified within the village, when it is hoped we can arrange a memorial event to include the School Children who worked on a project with ex-head master Terry Wain, to whom we are grateful for providing the names of those who lost their lives, to be inscribed on the memorial stone.

Things are progressing with our planned building work. We have found a roofer, at last, who is interested in re-roofing the church and we have some estimates for installing a new heating system in the church and wiring the extension (when it is built!!) We have also re-furbished our outside toilet with a new Porta-Potti.
