ABERMULE COMMUNITY CENTRE. After such a long time it is lovely to see groups gradually resuming their activities in the Community Centre. ABERMULE with LLANDYSSIL COMMUNITY COUNCIL:

BUSINESS PARK UPDATE: North Powys Recycling Facility, PCC have applied to NRW (Natural Resources Wales) for waste permit Ref. PAN 013001. Regarded by NRW as of 'High Public Interest' the six week consultation closes 1st July. Documentation available online at

The Community Council have been working on our response, once approved by Council will be posted on our website. Our objections include Odour Emissions, Fire prevention – lack of heat detection and suppression system, Food Waste storage, Pest control and data submitted pre-dates PCC inclusion of

residual, commercial, industrial and green waste on Abermule site. Concluding paragraph:-

The above points raise serious concerns about risk of odour pollution and the risk of fire in the facility discharging toxic smoke across the village, the A483 major trunk road, and Cambrian Rail either side of the Bulk Recycling Facility, as has happened in the Midlands and other sites. Abermule is a large village with a number of residential estates, a school, a caravan park, and a public house with an outside beer garden, with the Rivers Severn and Mule in close proximity. All could be adversely affected by the horrifying prospect of several hundred villagers trapped by surrounding dense smoke being brought down on them by the prevailing winds, and such risks are totally unacceptable. Concerns are also raised about the adequacy of available fire tenders and distance to travel to the site. None of the local towns have fully manned fire stations and so attendance to such a toxic fire would inevitably be too slow to prevent damage to village residents and employees working on the business site.

The impact of contaminated odorous air being blown towards the village may not be dangerous but would bring an unpleasantness in the summer months that would be unbearable and would we feel lead to

justified complaints at unprecedented levels.

SPEEDING TRAFFIC: The Council have received reports and politely request residents observe speed limits when travelling through the village. We don't want enforcement officers to catch you!

FLY TIPPING GARDEN WASTE: On a recent walk around the centre of both villages we were disappointed to see grass cuttings are still being tipped by waterways, risking potential contamination. At the rear of Millfield / Felin Hafren on the bank of the Severn and in Llandyssil on the access track into the Dragon Field. Green Waste bins are available to order via Powys County Council website, alternatively compost your own. Residents can report fly tipping on Powys County Council Website.

ALLOTMENTS: Some residents have shown interest in renting an allotment, in order for Council to consider investment in such a project, we require written requests from residents. Best practice appears to be where residents form an association to manage the allotments themselves.



The free, one hour driving assessment scheme is aimed at helping older drivers in the county to drive with more confidence and safety.
